Death Came Suddenly -- Rev. Richard Emmons Victim of Acute Indigestion

Active Member of Odd Fellow Fraternity, of the G.A.R., and Oldest Inhabitants Association

Rev. Richard Emmons, local preacher, connected with Trinity Methodist Episcopal Church, died last evening at 9:30 o'clock at the family residence, 1019 G street southeast. The cause of death was heart failure brought on by acute indigestion. Shortly after 9 o'clock Mr. Emmons, who was conversing with his wife in their room on the second floor, told her he would go to the cellar to see that the furnace fire was banked for the night. Presently he left the room on that mission, and as he reached the top step of the stairs leading to the front hall he suddenly pitched forward and fell to the floor below.

Mrs. Emmons heard the noise and, rushing to the hall, found her husband apparently lifeless upon the floor. She at once called several passersby and a physician was hurriedly summoned. After an examination the physician state that Mr. Emmons was dead. It was his belief that he died before his body struck the lower floor. Mr. Emmons had complained to his wife several times during the afternoon of indigestion, and after the evening meal had said he felt worse than he had during the preceding evening. His wife thought he would soon recover, and his sudden demise was a great shock to her. The funeral will take place from Trinity Methodist Episcopal Church Monday at 2 o'clock. The interment will be in Congressional cemetery.

Church and Fraternal Relations

For forty-five years Mr. Emmons was an active member of Fourth Street M.E. Church, now known as the Trinity M.E. Church, having been licensed as elder of that church. At the time of his death he was an active member of Union Lodge, No. 11, I.O.O.F.; of Farragut Post of the G.A.R., of which he was the adjutant, and of the Oldest Inhabitants' Association of the District of Columbia.

Mr. Emmons was married in 1850 to Elizabeth S. Wilson of Wilmington, Del. She died in 1899, and he was again married to Mrs. Clara Moffitt of Wilmington in June, 1904.

The following children of his first marriage survive him: George E. Emmons, Dr. Charles M. Emmons, Oliver A. Emmons and Howard O. Emmons of this city, and Richard W. Emmons of Brooklyn, N.Y.

Funeral Services Held -- Last Rites Over Remains of Rev. Richard Emmons

Before a large gathering of relatives and friends, in Trinity Methodist Episcopal Church, 5th street and Pennsylvania avenue southeast, where he had labored for a number of years as local preacher, funeral services over the remains of Rev. Richard Emmons, who died Friday evening, took place this afternoon at 2 o'clock. The services were particularly impressive. They were conducted by Rev. Henry S. France, pastor of Trinity Church; Rev. Dr. H.R. Naylor, presiding elder of the Washington district of the Methodist Episcopal Church, and Rev. E.H. Lamar, pastor of Wilson Memorial Church. During the course of the services Mrs. D. Olin Leach and Mr. William Palmer sang several appropriate hymns.

The pallbearers, who were all old friends of the deceased, were chosen from the membership of Union Lodge, No. 11, of the Odd Fellows; the Oldest Inhabitants' Association of the District of Columbia, and from the church, Farragut Post, Grand Army of the Republic. They were as follows:
