Estes</i> A message was received from Baltimore by the Washington police late last night telling of the finding of the body of a man supposed to be a resident of this city. The body was on the racks of the Pennsylvania railroad at Canton, a suburb of Baltimore. I is supposed to be that of Charles S. Estes, a barber.</p> <p>Alonzo Estes, brother of the individual referred to, called at police headquarters today to make some inquiries, having heard of the finding of the body. He resides at 629 Orleans place, but his former home was in Wilmington, Del. He told Inspector Boardman that his brother had recently worked in a barber shop near 3d and C streets northeast in this city. He said he had no seen Charles for about a month.
