Born Washington D.C., Dec. 8, 1844; son of John James and Mary Francis Ascough (Cushing) Gordon; educated private and public schools to 1857; Paris, France 1857-60, private school, Baltimore 1860-61; graduated U.S. Military, 1865; unmarried. 2d Lt. and 1st Lt., 12th Infantry, June 1865; transferred to 21 Infantry, Sept. 21, 1865; assigned to 4 Artillery, Dec. 15, 1870; graduated Artillery School, 1882; Capt. Dec. 1, 1883; Maj. 7 Artillery, March 8, 1898; Lt. Col. Artillery Corps, July 1, 1901; Col. Feb. 21, 1903; Brig. Genl. and Retired Dec. 8, 1908. Installed assistant professor and acting professor of French, U.S. Academy, 1868-73; served in 3d Army corps 1863; in Modoc Indian campaign, 1873; Nev. expedition, 1875 and in



Powder River expedition, 1876-77; military instructor Univ. of California 1877-78; was one of the pioneers in range-finding work, 1882-98; sharp shooter for 5 years; commanded artillery defenses for artillery operation. Died June 27, 1912.

While on cadet furlough, volunteered as Aid-de-Camp to Major General W.H. French and was engaged in the actions of Wapping Heights and Manassas Gap, July 23, 1863.
