Death of Tasker Lovelace

Victim of Uraemia After Illness of Short Duration

Tasker Lovelace died at the Emergency Hospital last night after having been a patient there about five hours. He was taken sick on the steamer Columbia while returning from Alexandria. The doctors diagnosed his ailment as uraemia. He was unconscious when taken off the steamer and did not regain consciousness before he died.

The deceased was fifty-six years old and lived at the home of his brother near Benning. It is stated that he was an inmate of St. Elizabeth's Hospital for the Insane for a short time. Coroner Nevitt investigated the death this morning and gave a certificate in accordance with the diagnosis of the hospital physicians. A brother of the deceased took charge of the body.
