<i>Infant Child of Lawrence Matthews Succumbs to Illness</i>			
Milburn Matthews, the seven-months-old child of Mr. and Mrs. Lawrence Matthews, died last night aboard a train while being brought home from Rectortown, Va. The child became ill earlier in the summer, and when its condition improved the mother took it to the country, thinking the change would be of benefit. There was no improvement in the child's condition, and yesterday afternoon Mrs. Matthews started to return home.			
Shortly before the city was reached the child died in its mother's arms. An undertaker was summoned to the Union station and the body was removed to the home of the Matthews family, 130 W street. The funeral of the little one will take place tomorrow afternoon, and the interment will be in Congressional Cemetery.
