<p>Shun, Moy Gue <i>The Evening Star, April 13, 1901</i> <i>Moy Shun's Estate</i> <i>Cousin Asks Court to Appoint an Administrator</i> A petition for the appointment of an administrator of the estate of Moy Shun, a citizen of the empire of China, who had resided for five years in the District, was today filed in the Probate Court. The application is made by Moy Pong, who declares that the decedent owned personal property amounting to \$360, and left as his next of kin Zon Shun, his wife, and four minor children, all living in China. Moy Peng says he is a cousin of the decedent, but waives any right to administer the estate, and asks that the letters be issued to Attorney J.
