*Will Bury Mr. Zanner Tomorrow Afternoon*

*Born in Bavaria, He Was a Resident of South Washington Nearly Fifty Years*

The funeral of William Zanner for forty-eight years a resident of the District of Columbia, and one of the pioneer residents of old South Washington, who died at his home, 526 4-1/2 street southwest yesterday morning, will be held at St. John's Lutheran Church, on 4-1/2 street, at 3 o'clock. Rev. Herman C. Foulz officiating. Burial will be in Congressional cemetery.

Mr. Zanner was born in Bavaria, February 2, 1825, and came to this country in 1852, locating first in Baltimore. He moved to this city to reside in 1863, and located in South Washington where he lived continuously up to the time of his death.

Mr. Zanner was one of the oldest members of St. John's Lutheran congregation and was for many years prior to his enforced retirement from active work one of the leaders in Church work. His long residence in one locality made him a well known figure in that section of the city.

He leaves a wife, Alwina Zanner; two daughters, Mrs. Charles Schafer and Mrs. John Gering, and two sons, William F. and Charles A. Zanner, the latter of the Edwards & Zanner Company of this city.
